A "Great Georgia Road Trip" would be incomplete without visiting High Falls State Park and the state's unofficial Fried Green Tomato capital along the way. The quaint, historic setting of Downtown Forsyth, with its eclectic array of local shopping and dining, is a great place to set up camp for a few days as you explore the incredible adventures to be had nearby!

Don't Miss: 1) Forsyth's Forsythia Festival the second weekend in March, 2) downtown's accessible Fox Hunt, 3) Country Club Park, home to walking trails and a splash pad, skate park and golf course, and 4) the Bark Park for your fur baby!

High Falls State Park

Named for its tumbling cascades along the Towaliga River, this dog-friendly park is equipped with a lake, trails, yurts, boat ramps and rentals, fishing docks, picnic shelters and more.

Don't Miss: The Historic Trail, a ADA accessible 0.5-mile trail through historic structures that tell you the story of the park's history.

Juliette

Sitting on the banks of the Ocmulgee River sits the tiny town of Juliette, home of the **Whistle Stop Café** and its fried green tomatoes of Hollywood fame. Wander the shops set along this railroad town-turned-movie set, have a bite to eat and take in the view or fish from the riverside park. Nearby, explore the 3600-acre Lake Juliette at **Dames Ferry Park**, where you can camp, fish and paddle to your adventurous heart's content.

Don't Miss: Juliette's Fried Green Tomato Festival, rolling into town each October.
